



Age at which modes become acceptable to parents





1.0 To provide a safe pedestrian zebra crossing facility on Spencer Road.	1.1 Investigate pedestrian zebra crossing facility on Spencer Rd close to walkway from Pannhill Place.	12-18 months	NSCC – Traffic Engineer		
2.0 To provide safe pedestrian facilities at East Coast Rd & Spencer Rd intersection.	2.1 Investigate signalised intersection treatment.	6 months	NSCC – Traffic Engineer		
3.0 To provide safe pedestrian facilities on school grounds, particularly in drop off zone.	3.1 Investigate installing zebra crossing through drop off zone to connect existing zebra crossing with stairs by school office.	6 months	School		
4.0 To reduce speed limit on Greville Rd.	4.1 Undertake speed limit review along Greville Rd.	6 months	NSCC – Traffic Engineer		
	4.2 Investigate installation of pedestrian crossing on north side of Hugh Green Drive connecting pedestrian refuge to east side of road at free left turn onto Greville Rd.	12 months			



















Manuka School Walkway Routes

Did you know there are some great walking routes to Manuka School via the school grounds?

Walkway 1: Neal Ave Walkway

A short three minute walk to school – no roads to cross.

Please ensure children always walk with adults or other children.



Walkway 2: Camrose Pl Walkway

A short two minute walk to school – no roads to cross.

Cars can turn safely in the culde-sac and there is a parking bay for pick up and drop off.

Please always pick children up from the footpath.



Walkway 3: Cunliffe Pl and Gladys Ave Walkway

Park & walk to school via the walkway from Cunliffe Place walkway. A short three minute walk to school. No roads to cross.

Walk from Gladys Ave. Park on the eastern side of the road to ensure no roads need to be crossed and walk to school via the Cunliffe place walkway.

We encourage you to walk with your children to and from school as it:

- Helps improve your child's fitness and health
- Gets them to arrive at school awake, alert and ready to learn
- Keeps the school gates clear of cars so it is safer for everyone
- Helps your child to learn road sense skills and become familiar with their community
- Reduces polluting car emissions in the environment

If you must drive, please observe and discuss with your child the following safe practices:

Dropping Off

- Park beside the footpath and ensure children exit vehicles on the footpath side, not the roadside.
- Children should walk on the footpath and use the pedestrian crossing if they need to cross the road.

Picking Up

- Park, then get out of the car and walk on the footpath to meet your child/ren.
- DO NOT WAVE THEM ACROSS THE ROAD educate them to use the pedestrian crossing.
- Children wait at classroom or on the paved area by office
- Use the footpath to walk to your car
- Parents please do not use the staff car park
- Always drive SLOWLY near the school watch out for pedestrians
